Two More Nova Scotia Universities Launch on the ARUCC MyCreds™ National Network

HALIFAX, N.S. - Today, the [Council of Nova Scotia University Presidents \(CONSUP\)](#) announces the launch of Acadia University and St. Francis Xavier University on the [ARUCC MyCreds™ National Network](#). The number of participating institutions across Nova Scotia has now risen to six.

Dalhousie University, University of King's College, Mount Saint Vincent University and Université Sainte-Anne were the first to launch. Cape Breton University, NSCAD University, Saint Mary's University and the Nova Scotia Community College are expected to be part of the MyCreds™ Network in the coming months.

This province-wide innovation and collaboration in Nova Scotia is a priority project emerging from CONSUP's [PSE Solutions strategy](#). Through this strategy, PSE institutions in Nova Scotia will work together to improve student experience, modernize systems and processes, and increase competitiveness in the higher education sector.

Leadership, guidance, and funding support from CONSUP and its partners at the Department of Advanced Education and [EduNova](#) are critical to the shared success of this initiative.
